### PROGRAM OVERVIEW:

The Carolina Care Pharmacy Network (CCPN) Internship is a two-year program spanning the four major outpatient sites at UNC Medical Center. These include: UNC Central Outpatient Pharmacy, UNC Employee Pharmacy, UNC Hillsborough Outpatient Pharmacy and the UNC Ambulatory Care Center Pharmacy. The student intern will be exposed to projects relating to discharge workflow, the meds-to-beds program, as well as projects relating to traditional retail settings. The intern will also engage in a longitudinal project with the aim of being able to present a poster at a conference.

There are a multitude of opportunities for the student intern to explore, including: competency in staffing an outpatient pharmacy, administrative projects relating to workflows/compliance, professional development through scheduled weekly/biweekly 1:1 meetings, networking with current residents, shadowing opportunities related to the intern's interests, as well as gaining knowledge about the UNC Pharmacy Assistance Program (PAP).
