
Nasopharyngeal Swab Method

Materials: BD Universal Viral Transport- contains one "flocked" swab and red-cap tube containing 3mls of Universal Transport Media

Available from Central Distribution Lawson # 050750





Collect specimens within the first 24-72 hours of onset of symptoms and no later than 5 days after onset of symptoms.

- 1. Have the patient blow his/her nose to remove excess mucous and tilt their head back.
- 2. Insert swab into one nostril all the way to the nasopharynx (resistance will be felt).
- 3. Rotate swab over surface of posterior nasopharynx for 10-15 seconds.
- 4. Withdraw swab from collection site; insert into transport tube and break swab at the score mark.
- 5. After collection, immediately transport specimen to the laboratory for testing. If transport to the laboratory is delayed, place specimen on ice or refrigerate.
